LIGHTING OF THE FOURTH ADVENT WREATH CANDLE

P: The season of Advent reminds us of the hope we have in the humanity of Jesus. God came to us, leaving behind the glory of heaven to be a person feeling pain, joy, loss, and love.

A: Today, we light the candle of hope, because in Jesus, heaven came to earth.

Light the first candle.

P: Advent reminds us the Prince of Peace came and lived among us. He felt stress within himself and conflict with other people, yet he chose his path of peace—peace within himself, and peace with humankind. A: Today, we light the candle of peace because Jesus showed us how to live in peace.

Light the second candle.

P: There is joy in the anticipation of the Advent season. Just as Mary waited for the birth of her son, we count the weeks and days to celebrate Christmas. Waiting makes space for imagination and preparation, and joy fills our hearts in that waiting.

A: Today, we light the candle of joy because joy is in the promise that the holy one is coming.

Light the third candle.

P: Love is the purpose, the reason, the source. Love is the all-in-all of Advent and Christmas. Without love, Christmas is just a resounding carol, a clanging jingle bell. But love transforms us into joyful participants in the great story of a wondrous birth.

A: Today, we light the candle of love because God so loved the world that God sent Jesus.

Light the fourth candle.

⁵ Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; ⁶ in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. ⁷ Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

⁸When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.






P God feeds us with tender mercy. Come to the table. C Thanks be to God

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION


