Joe's Introduction to Our Congregation

Dr. Joe Henry (he/him) has spent his life as a teacher, a performer and as a church music director. He has taught at various universities across the United States. He currently teaches piano in North Texas. He has served Catholic, Episcopal, Lutheran and Methodist communities as a choir director, music director, organist and vocal soloist for over forty years. He has a doctorate of musical arts in piano performance and organ performance. He is a veteran of the U.S. Army, and served as a piano player and as a chaplain assistant in eight different army units over a period of twenty one years. He is also a Returned Peace Corps Volunteer (Romania 1998-2000).

Dr. Henry Encourages You to Join the Choir!

Martin Luther believed that everyone, not just the choir, should actively participate in the liturgy through the singing of hymns and acclamations. While Luther's reforms included encouraging the congregation to sing, the role of the choir was never diminished. The choir remains integral to the liturgy, not only supporting the congregation's singing but also providing poetic and musical commentary through anthems and other special music. For me, this is an essential part of worship.

I want to invite everyone to join our choir, whether you have previous choral experience or are a first-time singer. All that's required is the ability to match pitch. Rehearsal schedules can be flexible, and your schedule can be accommodated. No matter your experience level, I'd love for you to be part of the group and share in the joy of making music together.

Our church is part of the ELCA.




ELCA stands for Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States with 3.3 million members across all 50 states. We are part of the Northern Texas Northern Louisiana Synod (NT-NL). A synod is a community of congregations in an area that are led by a Bishop and team who serve as regional support, and guide pastoral and other staff candidates.

Our church shares the beliefs of the ELCA.

By being a part of the ELCA we are saying we agree with their doctrine. All of that doctrine can be found on their website (elca.org). Here is a small piece of those beliefs:

"Jesus lived among us and demonstrated the good news in all he was and did. The good news is the promise that God loves us and saves us by grace alone. This promise was realized when Jesus was crucified. He died on the cross but was raised again in the body and in a new wholeness. As a result, through the gift of grace received by faith, all people can be made whole in Christ and set free to love and serve all people, particularly the vulnerable, just as God loves us.
